## ORDINANCE NO. 347

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 12 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFOR ADOPTED MAY 8, 1959" BY ADDING A SECTION THERETO RELATING TO A SEASONAL REQUIREMENT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF VARIOUS REGULATORY SIGNS ON OCEAN PLACE AND ELBERON AVENUE IN THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Loch Arbour as follows:

- Section 1. Section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 shall be amended by adding the following subsection:
- (b) Between May 1st and October  $1^{\rm st}$  in each year, the following signs shall be installed at the locations specified:
  - I. a STOP sign on the northeast corner of Ocean Place at the intersection with Elberon Avenue;
  - II. a DO NOT ENTER sign on the southwest corner of Elberon Avenue east of Ocean Place;
  - III. a NO OUTLET LOCAL TRAFFIC AND EMERGENCY VEHICLES ONLY on the southeast corner of Elberon Avenue at Ocean Avenue

## Section 2. REPEAL, SEVERABILITY is amended as follows:

- Section 1. Ordinances No. 113, 186, 249, 301 and 335 of the Village of Loch Arbour are hereby repealed.
- Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **Section 3.** If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

## Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law and approval by the Commissioner, New Jersey State Department of Transportation.
