## ORDINANCE NO. 291

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 67 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND CONTROL OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC AND PARKING UPON THE STREETS, HIGHWAYS AND ROAD IN THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF, AND SPECIFICALLY REPEALING ORDINANCES NO. 10, 22, 23 AND 34 AND ANY AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH" BY ADDING A SECTION THERETO RELATING TO TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING PARKING VEHICLES FOR SNOW PLOWING, SNOW REMOVAL AND OTHER EMERGENCIES ON VARIOUS STREETS OR PORTIONS THEREOF

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Loch Arbour, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey:

Section 1. Articles 3 of Ordinance No. 67 is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows:

Section 302. Whenever there is an accumulation of three (3") inches or more of snow on the streets of the Village of Loch Arbour and for the period of 48 hours following the end of the snowfall, the following action shall be taken:

- a. All vehicles shall be parked off the streets.
- b. If off-street parking is not available, vehicles shall park on the north and east sides of all streets until snowplowing has been accomplished.
- c. After snowplowing has been completed on the south and west sides of all streets, all vehicles shall be moved to the south and west sides of all streets and snowplowing shall continue on the north and east sides of all streets.

Section 2. Any vehicle parked or standing in violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the sum determined by municipal contract for the removal and storage of said vehicle before regaining possession of the vehicle.

Section 3. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of any section or provision of this Ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a fine of up to \$100.00 for the first occurrence, up to \$500.00 for the second occurrence and up to \$1,000 for the third or more occurrence.

Section 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication as required by law, subject only to the disapproval of the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation.
