ORDINANCE NO. 318

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT ILLICIT CONNECTIONS
TO THE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM OPERATED
BY THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH
AND TO PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR THE FAILURE TO COMPLY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES of the Village of Loch Arbour as follows:

SECTION I. Purpose:

An ordinance to prohibit illicit connections to the municipal separate storm sewer system operated by the Village of Loch Arbour, so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

SECTION II. Definitions:

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory. The definitions below are the same as or based on corresponding definitions in the New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination

System (NJPDES) rules at N.J.A.C. 7:14A-1.2.

- a. Domestic sewage waste and wastewater from humans or household operations.
- b. Illicit connection any physical or non-physical connection that discharges domestic sewage, non-contact cooling water, process wastewater, or other industrial waste (other than stormwater) to the municipal separate storm sewer system operated by the Village of Loch Arbour, unless that discharge is authorized under a NJPDES permit other than the Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit (NJPDES Permit Number NJ0141852). Non-physical connections may include, but are not limited to, leaks, flows, or overflows into the municipal separate storm sewer system.
- c. Industrial waste non-domestic waste, including, but not limited to, those pollutants regulated under Section 307(a), (b), or (c) of the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. \$1317(a), (b), or (c)).
- d. Municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4)—a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, manmade channels, or storm drains) that is owned or operated by the Village of Loch Arbour or other public body, and is designed and used for collecting and conveying stormwater.
- e. NJPDES permit a permit issued by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to implement the New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NJPDES) rules at N.J.A.C. 7:14A
- f. Non-contact cooling water water used to reduce temperature for the purpose of cooling. Such waters do not come into direct contact with any raw material, intermediate product (other than heat) or finished product. Non-contact cooling water may however contain algaecides, or biocides to control fouling of equipment such as heat exchangers, and/or corrosion inhibitors.
- g. Person any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- h. Process wastewater any water which, during manufacturing or processing, comes into direct contact with or results from the production or use of any raw material, intermediate product, finished product, byproduct, or waste product. Process wastewater includes, but is not limited to, leachate and cooling water other than non-contact cooling water.

i. Stormwater - water resulting from precipitation (including rain and snow) that runs off the land's surface, is transmitted to the subsurface, is captured by separate storm sewers or other sewerage or drainage facilities, or is conveyed by snow removal equipment.

SECTION III. Prohibited Conduct:

No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged through an illicit connection to the municipal separate storm sewer system operated by the Village of Loch Arbour any domestic sewage, non-contact cooling water, process wastewater, or other industrial waste (other than stormwater).

SECTION IV. Enforcement:

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Police Department pursuant to the current Interlocal Services Agreement, the Zoning Official or the Sewer System Operator (C-4) of the Village of Loch Arbour.

SECTION V. Penalties:

For a violation of any provision of this Ordinance, the maximum penalty, upon conviction thereof, shall be a fine not exceeding One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty ((\$1,250.00) or imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days, or any combination thereof. Each and every day in which a violation of this Ordinance shall exist shall constitute a separate violation.

SECTION VI. Severability:

- A. Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.
- B. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION VII. Effective date:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.
